November Highlights

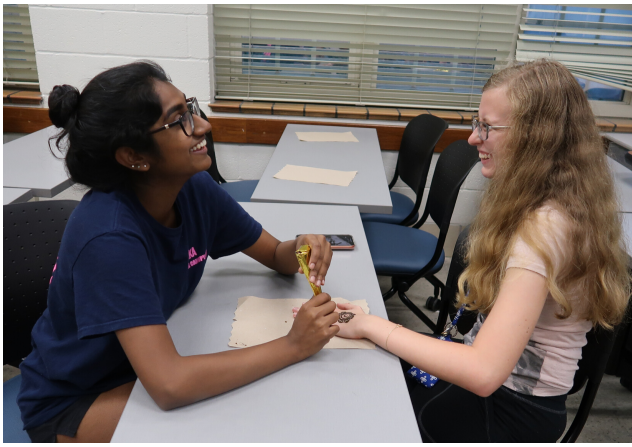
